



Michael A. Acker, M.D. is the Chief of the Division of Cardiothoracic Surgery at the University of Pennsylvania Health System and a Professor of Surgery at the University of Pennsylvania School of Medicine. He is a graduate of Brown University where he received both his BS and MD degrees.

He maintains an active surgical practice focusing on the care of patients with end-stage heart failure, coronary artery disease and valvular disease. In addition, he has a special expertise in mitral valve repair for advanced myxomatous disease or in patients with end-stage heart failure. He is a national leader in the use of mechanical assist devices as a bridge to transplantation or as permanent therapy for end-stage heart failure. He is director of an active research laboratory at the University of Pennsylvania investigating both biologic and mechanical ventricular assistance.

He was the recipient of the Louis Duhring Outstanding Clinical Specialist Award in 2002 from the University of Pennsylvania School of Medicine.
