SET-UP FOR ROUTINE ANESTHESIA IN CAM ENDOSCOPY

INTRAVENOUS POLE

- o 0.25, 0.5 or 1 L saline
- o Tubing with check valve
- o Alaris Pump

AIRWAY

- Have bag and mask hooked up to alternative oxygen supply ready to go for all cases
- o Make sure that nasal airways with lubricant are available
- Have laryngoscope, endotracheal tube, oral airways, and laryngeal mask airways just in case
- o Special cannulas for CO₂ detection:
 - For upper endoscopic procedures, use Nasal Filterline® (make sure the perforations through which oxygen is delivered are in front of the prongs)
 - For colonoscopy only, use Smart CapnolineTM oral/nasal cannula

• MEDICATIONS

- o Endoscopy nurses have kit with epinephrine, atropine, glucagon, diphenhydramine, naloxone, and flumazenil
- o Cassettes with propofol and cassettes with other medications useful to have in the room for endoscopy (lidocaine, glycopyrrolate, succinylcholine, phenylephrine, ephedrine, esmolol, etc.) are provided; secure with ties between cases
- Other medications and controlled substances can be obtained from the Pyxis machines in the hallway
- SUCTION
- **SUPPLY CARTS** see protocol for access
- **ANESTHESIA RECORDS** find in PennChart under HUP Sched -> PCAM EC
- Call anesthesia technician for assistance as needed (number is usually posted in the procedure rooms)
