Preparation for Class:

The PALS Provider Recertification Course is designed to teach and review the lifesaving skills required to be both a team member and a team leader in either an in-hospital or out-of-hospital setting.

The PALS course covers extensive material in a short period of time so it is **IMPERATIVE** that you will need to prepare for the course beforehand.

You should prepare for this course as follows:

1. You are expected to read the 2025 PALS Provider Manual prior to attending the course.
2. Pre-course checklist: Complete the pre-course checklist that came with your PALS Course guide, **Bring checklist to the course**
3. CPR competency: Be prepared to pass the child 1 rescuer CPR/AED and Infant 1 & 2 rescuer CPR skills test. You will not be taught how to do CPR or how to use an AED. You **must know** in advance. The resuscitation scenarios require that your BLS skills and knowledge be current. Review and understand all BLS 2025 guidelines, especially related to the pediatric patient.

1. **PALS Precourse Self- Assessment and Precourse Work (required):** You can access the PALS Precourse Self- Assessment and Precourse Work material by visiting <https://elearning.heart.org/course/1538>. You will be directed to create a free account prior to having access to the course material. Please be advised, you will not be able to take the classroom-based course without the certificate of completion.
2. PALS algorithms and flowcharts: Be familiar with the PALS algorithms and flowcharts that you can apply in the clinical scenarios. **You MAY use the PALS algorithm cards** provided in your packet in the practice and testing scenarios.
3. Supplement knowledge: Review the PALS Provider Manual and Course Guide. Pay attention to the systematic approach to pediatric assessment.
4. Course Agenda will be provided upon arrival at the course.

It is essential that you bring your PALS Course Guide to class; you will need it during each lesson in the course.

Late Policy:

If you arrive more than 15 minutes for class, you will not be permitted to attend the course. You and/or your department may be billed **\$190** for the cost of the course.
